PLAYING MUSIC IS MORE THAN JUST MEMORIZING A BUNCH OF CHORDS ON YOUR INSTRUMENT.

That's difficult. And takes a long time.

TYPES OF GROUPS YOU CAN PLAY IN

- Relaxed jam session (like ours)
- Classroom
- Strict jam session
- Circle jam (ex. bluegrass circle)
- Band
- Symphony / Orchestra

Low key

Lots of etiquette and rules

BASIC ETIQUETTE

- Have fun
- Keep your uke in tune
- Keep a steady rhythm
 - It's very easy to speed up
- Listen to others
 - If you can't hear the lead, you are probably playing too loud
- Follow the leader (if there is one)
- Don't be afraid of new material
- Have fun

BEFORE THE JAM

- Review the set list
- Listen to any songs you may not know already
- Try to practice the songs
 - Chord changes
 - Lyrics

DURING THE JAM

- Starting a song
 - Watch the leader
 - He/she will nod to start the group
 - He/she might play an intro, then you join in after
- Don't be a show off unless you have a solo
- Between songs
 - Try not to noodle
 - Double check your tuning

WHAT TO DO WHEN YOU'RE LOST

- Don't worry. It's OK! ©
- You have a few options
 - 1. Stop playing and listen for the lead, then rejoin the lead when you're ready
 - Vamp the song's root chord (ex Key of C Major > vamp C)
- Chords you don't know
 - Play the "Zed" chord
 - Play the Major or Minor version of the chord (ex. C7 > just play C)
 - Play nothing and wait until the next chord
