

Other Options

Select how far up the neck you'd like to see chords.

Only show chords above this fret: Open (nut)



- Show smaller chart versions
- Show the notes played by each string (full sized charts only)
- Use English note names(ex. C, G, F)
- Use Solfège note names(ex. Do, Sol, Fa)
- Show Pitches across the top (Ab, A, Bb, B, C...)
- Show Chords across the top (Major, Minor, 7th...)

Transposes the chart's rows and columns


Only shows chords further up the neck (beyond the selected fret)

Displays visually smaller charts



Displays notes for each string

Toggles between English letters and Solfege symbols (used outside of the US)



MULTI-VERSION CHARTS

- Will display all of the fingering versions in the database for the selected Chords
- Great for when you're learning chords up the neck or when you just want different fingering options



MULTI-INSTRUMENT CHARTS

Select up to 4 Instrument / Tunings

Select Instrument / Tunings:

- Ukulele Standard / C Tuning [G,C,E,A]
 5-String Banjo Open G Tuning [G,D,G,B,D]
 Guitar Standard Tuning [E,A,D,G,B,E]
 Mandolin Standard Tuning [GG,DD,AA,EE]
- It will display the selected chord fingerings for each one
- Great if you know one instrument and are learning another

SONG DISPLAY OPTIONS

This tells ICDb which chord shapes to use. Generally, uke players will want to see chords using "C Shapes" meaning shapes C, F and G.

Sung Key

This tells ICDb which key you'd like the song to be sung in (based on your voice). It uses a capo to modulate keys in order to keep the Chord Shapes what you want.

OTHER OPTIONS

Allows you to dictate where chord notations are to be displayed with respect to the lyrics.

Only shows chords further up the neck (beyond the selected fret)

Allows you to dictate where the fingering charts are to be displayed with respect to the lyrics (or none at all)


Shows chord notation in English letters, Solfege symbols (used outside of the US), or Nashville Numbering

- Show lyrics with the chords above the lyrics (ex. Happy birthday to you)
- O Show lyrics with the chords above the lyrics as little chord charts (ex. Happy birthday to you)
- Show lyrics with the chords in-line with the lyrics (ex. [G]Happy Birthday to [D]You)
- Show only the lyrics with no chords (ex. Happy Birthday to You)
- Don't show the lyrics at all

Select how far up the neck you'd like to see chords.

Choose a fret below and only chords with fingerings at or above that fret will be displayed Only show chords above this fret: Open (nut)

- Show chord charts at the top of the song
- Show the relavent chord charts above each section
- Show the relavent chord charts next to each section
- Don't show any chord charts at all
- Use English note names (ex. [C], [D], [G])
- Use Solfège note names (ex. [Do], [Re], [Sol])
- Show chord as Roman Numerals (ex. [I], [II], [V])





SET LISTS

- Users can create their own set lists (like we use here)
- You can add songs to the set list and order them
- Edit each song's Arrangement independently
 - Each song can have a different instrument
 - Each song can have its own Chord Shape Key and Sung Key
 - Set display options (notation options, show/hide fingerings, etc...)
